

The BSO Challenge





How to complete the BSO Challenge

BEAVERS

Pick 2 countries in BSO, do 3 challenges for each country (6 in total).

CUBS

Pick 2 countries in BSO, at least one of the countries must be from a different District. Do 4 challenges for each country (8 in total).

SCOUTS

Pick 2 countries in BSO, do 5 challenges for each country (10 in total).

EXPLORERS

Pick 2 countries in BSO, at least one of the countries must be from a different District. Do 6 challenges for each country (12 in total).

NOTES

You can mix and match challenges and countries (for example Beavers could do 3 countries, 2 challenges for each). As long as you do the minimum number of challenges for your section, you just need to pick at least 2 different countries and do at least 2 challenges for each country.

Young People must be able to point to the countries chosen on a world map.

7. Know what currency another BSO country uses (look at / handle some if possible) and how it is split up.		
8. Discuss 3 ways another BSO country's culture is different from the one you live in.		
9. Talk about and / or colour in pictures of another BSO country's national dress.		
10. Send a written letter to another BSO group in one of your chosen countries. (each YP should write their own letter)

8. Discuss 5 ways another BSO country's culture is different from the one you live in.		
9. Practice one of these cultural differences for the evening		
10. Find out 5 facts about the most famous geographical landmark of another BSO country.		
11. Send a written letter to another BSO group in one of your chosen countries. Make sure to name your favourite Scouting activity!		
12. Create a 3D model of another BSO country's most famous building out of newspaper, tape, cardboard tubes, etc. Make sure it can stand unaided!
